1L - Andy Collins - Bensalem High School and Princeton University Track Athlete and Soccer Player. Andy was the captain of both the soccer and track and field teams at Bensalem; he was First Team All-League in soccer and won the PIAA State Indoor Track Championship in the 600 yard Dash with the fastest time in the nation. After Bensalem, Andy attended Princeton University where he captained the Track and Field team. He was First Team All-America in the Distance Medley Relay and Heptagonal League Champion in the 400 Intermediate Hurdles in 3 consecutive years ('94,'95,'96) and the 500 meter champion in '96. He was All-Ivy League First Team in 1994-95 and 1995-96. He qualified for the Olympic Trials in 1996 in the 400 Intermediate Hurdles

2L - Lynn Comer - Neshaminy High School and Slippery Rock University. Lynn was a 4 year All-District One and All-Lower Bucks swimmer during her years at Neshaminy. At Slippery Rock, she was a 4Time All-American Swimmer and a 4Time All-American Water Polo Player. In April 2003, Lynn became the first woman inducted into the Collegiate Water Polo Hall of Fame, and in February, 2004, she was among the first group of women inducted into the United States Water Polo Hall of Fame. Lynn was the first woman to coach any NCAA Division 1 Men's Team Sport coaching water polo at Bucknell University. She was a 12 year member of the US Women's National Water Polo Team and Team Captain for 6 of those years. In 1981 she received the Sullivan Award for Outstanding Achievement in US Aquatics.

3L - Addie Crump Jackson - Bensalem High School and Temple University Basketball Player. Addie received All-State and All-America nominations in her senior year while averaging 24 points per game. She scored over 1200 points in her high school career. She was named the 1983 Courier Times Player of the Year and voted Suburban One MVP. At Temple Addie was a three-year starter at point guard and the team's 3rd leading scorer all three years. She was inducted into the Temple Hall of Fame in 1999, the Big Five Hall of Fame in 1994, and the Bensalem Hall of Fame in 1989.

4L - Ann Paul Gold - Central Bucks West and Lafayette College Field Hockey and Lacrosse Coach. During her 10 year tenure at CB West as Field Hockey coach, Ann's teams won three Bux-Mont Championships and the 1981 PIAA State Championship. As Head Lacrosse Coach, Ann's teams won 6 Bux-Mont Championships in her seven years and District One Titles in 1977 and 78. Her overall Field Hockey record at West was 84-26-12; her overall Lacrosse record was 87-11-3.

In 1982 Ann accepted the Field Hockey and Lacrosse jobs at Lafayette College where she stayed for 25 years becoming the winningest coach in any sport in Lafayette's storied history. Ann's Field Hockey teams have won 9 Patriot League Crowns, 2 ECAC Championships and one ECC championship. In lacrosse, Ann's teams have won 7 Patriot League Championships and two East Coast Conference Championships. Ann has several Coach of the Year honors at all levels.

5L- Dave June - Pennsbury High School and Penn State University Baseball and Soccer. Dave compiled a 24-6-2 record with 11 shutouts as a goalkeeper in 1974-75. In baseball Dave pitched 3 no-hitters and 1 perfect game in the 1976 season with a record of 10-1 and an ERA of 0.86. He was Courier Times Player of the Year and was an All-Area, All-Section 1, and Trenton Times First team selection in 1976. At Penn State Dave became the first freshman to pitch a no-hitter on 5/11/77 against Indiana University of PA. He compiled a career record of 15-3 and an ERA of

6L - Rick Lewis - Woodrow Wilson High School and Georgia Tech University Football Player. Rick was a First Team All-Lower Bucks selection in Football and Baseball during his time at Wilson in 1965 to 1967. He was the winner of the Delaware Valley Notre Dame Club Knute Rockne Award and named to the Pennsylvania Big 33 Team in 1966. He was recruited by 52 colleges and universities . After graduation he attended the US Military Academy at West Point where he quarterbacked the Plebes to a 9-0 season. Rick left the academy and attended Georgia Tech where he started every game as a defensive back. In 1971 he was named to the pre-season All-America Team.. Rick played in the 1970 Sun Bowl and the 1971 Peach Bowl; he was the winner of the Clyde Lawson Award for Outstanding Back at Georgia Tech. In 1972, he played for the Pittsburgh Steelers.

7L - Len Lynch - Bishop Egan High School and University of Maryland Football Player. Len was a fixture on All-Catholic and All-Area teams at offensive guard from 1979 and 1980. He was First Team Bucks Courier Times and Philadelphia Daily News. Len was an Honorable Mention All-America and selected for the Big 33 Team. He was voted onto the Philadelphia Daily News All Decade Team.

After high school Len attended the University of Maryland where he started at offensive guard all 3 years. In 1984 he was 2nd Team All-ACC and Honorable Mention All-America. In 1985 he was voted team captain, made First Team ALL-ACC , Honorable Mention All-America, received the Toyota Leadership Award , and received the James H. Tatum Award for Maryland's Outstanding Offensive Lineman. Following graduation , Len was drafted by the New York Giants; unfortunately, he suffered a career ending knee injury, ending his dream of playing in the NFL

8L - Maggie Moyer - Central Bucks West High School 3- sport athlete. Maggie led the Bucks to 3 straight PIAA State Soccer Championships in 1993,94, and 95; in 94 and 95, Maggie was selected 1st Team All-State. She culminated her soccer career by being selected to the All-America Team in '95. .Maggie also excelled in Field Hockey being named 1st Team All-Suburban in her senior year. Basketball was Maggie's third sport in which she garnered Honorable Mention All-League honors. She attended Rutgers University on a soccer scholarship; she started all 4 years and again garnered 1st Team All-New Jersey honors for 3 consecutive seasons

9L - Cathy Osmer - Rahill - Central Bucks East High School and University of North Carolina Field Hockey Player. From 1984 to 1988, Cathy earned 9 Varsity letters at East; she was All-League for three years in Field Hockey , 4 years in lacrosse and 2 years in basketball. She was High School All-America in 1988 in Field Hockey, and 1987-88 in lacrosse. Cathy received a scholarship to UNC where she was on the 1989 NCAA National Championship Field Hockey team. Cathy was an ALL-Conference selection in 1989

10L - Meghan Pattyson - Central Bucks East High School and the University of Connecticut Basketball Player. Meghan scored 1260 career points at East from 1985 to 1988. She was First Team All-Area, All-Bux-Mont, and All-Suburban One in her junior and senior seasons; in 1988 she was named All-State. In soccer, Meghan was named All-Suburban One First Team in her senior season.

Meghan continued her scoring prowess at UConn scoring 1000points while earning All-Big East Honors. She was the Big East Most Outstanding Performer in 1991 and Team Captain in 1992; she was an assistant coach of the 1995 UConn Women's NCAA Championship Team. Meghan is a member of the New England Hall of Fame (2013) and the state of Connecticut's Women's Basketball Hall of Fame (2009).

12L -Brian Penecale -CB East and West Chester University Football Player. Brian was one of the finest multi-sport athletes ever to compete for CB East. During his 3 years, Brian earned 9 varsity letters in 4 sports. He was First Team All-League in baseball, basketball, football, and track. *The Intelligencer* and *Philadelphia Inquirer* selected him to their All-Area Football team. In his junior and senior years, he was selected to *the Intelligencer* All-Area Basketball team. In track, Brian was the Colonial Division Champion in the Javelin and the High Jump.

At West Chester Brian established NCAA and school receiving records ; he was selected to the *Street & Smith's* and Nike Football All-America Team.

13L -Terry Pezzola - Bishop Egan High School Football Player - Terry was one of the finest football players ever to grace the gridiron in the Golden Era of Bucks football in the early sixties. As a running back at Egan, he was the 1961 Lower Bucks County Scoring Champion with 83 points, scoring 13 TDs in 10 games. In 1962, he was second in the area in scoring with 142 points with 23 TDs in 10 games. In one game against Woodrow Wilson in 1962, Bucks County "Back of the Year". He accepted a full scholarship to the University of Maryland where he led the "Baby Terps" in rushing his freshman year. Terry was elected to the Bishop Egan Hall of Fame in 1975 and the Bristol Township Hall of Fame in 2007.

14 L- Marc Sodano - Central Bucks East and North Carolina State University wrestler. Marc compiled a 94-13-2 record in his career at CB East. He was league champion all 4 years, 3 time District 1 Champion, 2 time Regional Champion, and 1982 PIAA State Champion. Marc's college career followed a similar path at NC State. He had a career collegiate record of 95-15-4; he was an NCAA qualifier 4 times, an ACC Champion twice and an All-American. He also distinguished himself as a n Academic All-American while at NC State.

15L - Marty Stern - CB East and Villanova Men's and Women's Track and Cross Country Coach. Marty was one of the most successful track and cross country coaches in the history of Bucks County and Villanova University. From 1984 to 1994, he was Head Coach of the Villanova Women's Program. His Cross Country Team won 5 consecutive NCAA Division 1 Championships from 1989 thru 1993. From '90 to '94, he was the Head Coach for the Men's and Women's programs. His teams in both programs won 23 Big East Titles. Marty was National Coach of the Year several times and was named one of the coaches to our 1988 Olympic Team in Seoul, Korea.

16L - Paul Wilson - CB East Track and Cross Country Coach - Paul's teams at East won 18 League Championships and 3 PIAA District One championships in Cross Country. He was the *Philadelphia Inquirer* Coach of the Year 4 times in Cross Country and 2 times in Track.

17L - Ken Worthen - Bensalem Track Coach whose teams won 2 PIAA State Track Championships.

18L - Jay Wright - Council Rock High School , Bucknell University Basketball Player and Villanova Basketball Coach. Jay was a standout high school basketball player at Council Rock HS and a collegiate player at Bucknell. He was the Head Basketball Coach at Hofstra from 1994 to 2001; his teams compiled a 122-85 record and 2 NCAA Tournament appearances. Jay became Villanova's Head Coach in 2001 and still remains as Head Coach; his teams have compiled a 285 - 149 record, 9 NCAA Tournament appearances, and in 2008 - 09 a Final Four appearance. Jay was named the National Coach of the Year in 2006.
